# STATISTICS AND INFORMATION



The Town Council is administered as a first tier local government authority in an area whose County Authority responsibilities are maintained by Surrey County Council and whose District Council responsibilities are maintained by Reigate & Banstead Borough Council.

There are approximately 22,000 people residing within the boundary of this Town Council of which 16,195 are registered electors.

The Precept is collected on the Town Council's behalf by Reigate & Banstead Council. For the fiscal year 2009/10, it is set at £ 280,886. This equates to a sum of £32.59 per band D household. The Precept for the previous fiscal year 2008/09 was set at £ 278,560.

### FINANCE & GENERAL PURPOSES COMMITTEE REPORT

#### **Committee Responsibilities**

The Committee supervises all financial, administrative and civic matters and ensures that all procedures and financial transactions are dealt with in accordance with the various statutes governing local authority activities. Accounts are checked regularly and two councillors are rostered to conduct an audit prior to each F & GP Committee meeting. A number of councillors serve on sub-committees and outside bodies, as described elsewhere in this Annual Report, which report back to this committee.

#### Accounts 2007/08

The Council's accounts are run strictly in accordance with various statutory instruments and guidance received from the National Association of Local Councils. I am pleased to report that all our procedures and internal controls were conducted to the satisfaction of our internal auditor. In the opinion of BDO Stoy Hayward plc, the external auditors, our accounts received unqualified acceptance, and we are fully in accordance with the Audit Commission's requirements. The audited balance sheet for 2007/08 showed an increase in the general reserve from £30,550 to £39,909.

Looking towards the end of the financial year 2008/2009, the Council accounts remain in a strong state and, at the time of preparing this report, it is expected that the general reserve will be in excess of £40,000, as was forecast when declaring the precept in December 2008.

#### Financial Year 2009/10

The precept has been set for a total net figure of £280,886 (compared to the net figure of £278,560 for 2008/09). This means that the town element of Council Tax will be £32.60, representing an annual increase of 10p per Band D household (+ 0.31 per cent).

The Town Council fully recognises that these are difficult economic times and a thorough review of all the Council's costs and services has been conducted. This action has allowed the annual increase of the Precept to be kept within modest levels. The increase of 0.31 per cent compares with the Annual Retail Prices Index (RPI) increase of 4.2% and the annual Consumer Price Index (CPI) of 4.5%, announced in November 2008.

Prudent use of Council finances has allowed the Council to use £34,000 of its general reserves towards next year's costs. Whilst the charges for some of our community facilities, such as the use of the Albert Rooms main hall, were not increased this year, the charges will be increased from April 2009 to take account of the improved facilities. There will also be differing scales for businesses and local organisations.


The Town Council also has a duty to provide for future likely expenditure. I am pleased to announce that the Council is therefore increasing its earmarked funds by £19,000 for football pitch improvements, buildings maintenance and community funds.

We have considered the continuing need to improve security in our recreation grounds. Therefore a provision has been made for CCTV enhancements, which will be carried out in consultation with Surrey Police. There will also continue to be a commitment for regular security patrols in all our parks to aid the safety of all members of public.

The Council has made a provision for floral displays in the town centre in support of our planned entry for South and South East in Bloom 2009, having already won two silver awards in 2008. Sponsorship from local businesses will also be sought.

This Council will also continue to seek funding from appropriate bodies. To date we are preparing a substantial bid to the Football Foundation for work on our football pitches at Court Lodge Fields. Other funding has been generously offered from our local Borough and County Councillors' Initiative Schemes, for which the Town Council expresses its gratitude.

#### Website

The website continues to go from strength to strength culminating in the Council receiving the top award of NALC's Website of the Year in 2008 against strong competition.

#### Newsletter

Quarterly issues of our newsletter, Horley Highlights, are produced and delivered to the public using up to 50 distribution points, as well as to a number of households. We continue to save printing costs by using a colour copier for the printing. In partnership with our local Horley publishers, MAD Ideas, a fully revised town guide will be produced later in the summer.

#### **Government Initiatives**

The Council has fully revised its Freedom of Information Act Publication Scheme, which allows members of the public access to specified council documentation and publications. The Internal Audit Committee, comprising Cllr Olliver and myself, conducts regular reviews of the audit programme. In liaison with the clerk, a structured internal audit programme has been developed.

#### **Town Council Offices**

The Town Council moved from its former offices to the Albert Rooms in 2007, with the staff using temporary accommodation in a Portakabin in the rear car park until September 2008. The extension and refurbishment of the Albert Rooms now provides a modern community facility, which I am pleased to report was completed within our financial estimates and, just as importantly, within our predicted timescales, which kept disruption to our hirers to a minimum.

### LEISURE & AMENITIES COMMITTEE REPORT

Horley Town Council provides and maintains four recreation areas. These are the Horley Recreation Ground, Court Lodge playing fields, Michael Crescent Centenary Park and Emlyn Meadows.

The Leisure and Amenities Committee also continues to support Horley in Bloom and my thanks go to all the participants and volunteers who make this a successful event. Building on our success of last year's silver medal (2007-08) for the South East in Bloom competition, this municipal year (2008-09) we surpassed ourselves with two silver medals: one for the Town Centre and one for the Memorial Gardens. I would like to thank all the Councillors who helped with weeding and planting, and my partner Tania Peppiatt for making the Memorial Gardens look picture perfect. Fingers crossed for better next year!

For the Town Centre Hanging Baskets, I am sure you will all join in with me in thanking Amethyst Horticulture for stunning displays that lasted all summer and beyond, still looking wonderful. My thanks also go to Reigate and Banstead Borough Council for their planters and to the staff at Horley Town Council for making our Town a really colourful and pleasant place to enjoy.

I am glad to report that the Sangers Drive Allotment Holders have once again done a fantastic job in ensuring, in my opinion, that we still have the best allotments in the Borough of Reigate and Banstead.

This year you will have noticed improvements to the Horley Recreation Ground in the form of new play equipment for the 7-14 year olds. The old existing equipment, following reports from our playgrounds' inspectors, was deemed to be coming to the end of its working life and therefore, for safety reasons and improvements, a new Climbing Frame, a "Whizzer" and a "Tornado Carousel" were added.

In April 2009 work will start on the Ornamental Gardens. The Gardens will be in the main cleared, remodelled and replanted. The Gardens will be made more open to all and new benches will be installed. We hope that the work will be completed before the South East in Bloom judging in July 2009.

For the municipal year 2009-2010 we are planning improvements to the drainage in the children's play area and the second phase of footpaths improvements, both at Horley Recreation Ground. Also, small improvements will be made to the play equipment at Court Lodge Playing Fields and Michael Crescent.

I am pleased to announce that the grant for the maintenance of the Churchyards is still continuing and has been increased. I think you will all agree that the Churchyards are much improved on previous years.

Emlyn Meadows will again have wild flower seeds sewn. Hopefully, this will provide a colourful display later in the year, blending in with the natural surroundings.

This year we commissioned a tree survey for all the trees in our Parks and Grounds. As a result, several trees need attention and this will start with tree work in the Horley Recreation Ground and Court Lodge Playing Fields.

I still maintain my weekly inspections of all the Town Council's grounds and I am pleased to report that all facilities are well used, even Tennis Courts during the winter months. I actually witnessed tennis being played over the Christmas period!

I also attend bi-monthly meetings with the Police, along with other Town Councillors. This works well and is still proving to be beneficial. Every month I meet regularly with our grounds maintenance Contractors and the Clerk and discuss any issues that may arise, as well as any planned events, such as the fair and the fireworks display. This April we will have, for the first time, an all-human Circus in the Horley Recreation Ground!

#### Acknowledgements

First I would like to thank my Vice-Chairman, Cllr Mike George, and all the members of the Committee for their hard work throughout the past year. The Committee has had to deal with many issues and members have attended many meetings to cope with the growing number of Horley's planning applications. I also thank the Town Clerk for his sound administration and support of this committee.

#### **Committee Responsibilities**

The Borough Council has a statutory duty to seek Horley Town Council's comments on all applications for development within the parish boundary. The Planning Committee is delegated to act on these matters. The Committee also considers planning matters in neighbouring areas deemed to have a significant impact on Horley. These mainly derive from Crawley Borough Council and relate to Gatwick Airport. However, the Council also receives consultations from Surrey County Council and the neighbouring districts of Mole Valley and Tandridge. Over the course of the Council year there will have been 10 Planning Committee meetings and statistics are available later in this report.

#### **Public Representation**

Representations are always encouraged from the public at the Public Forum section of the Committee meetings. These have affected a number of planning applications and the following issues: Horley North East and North West sectors, Town Centre Regeneration, the sale of Gatwick Airport by BAA plc, and the Draft South East Plan

### TOWN AWARDS

#### The Town Awards scheme has been in operation since 2000, with the first awards being presented at the Annual Town Meeting of 10 April 2000.

Nominations for Town Awards are invited every year, when any resident of the Town can complete a nomination form, together with a seconder, to propose an individual for outstanding service or commitment to the town. Horley Town Council is responsible for the administration and final selection of award winners according to strict guidelines and criteria.

An Awards Sub Committee reviews the nominations and makes its recommendations to the Council. Award winners receive a Town Badge, a Certificate of Commendation, and their Citation. Presentations are usually made either at the Annual Town Meeting, or at other appropriate events, subject to the award winners' approval.

In 2008 the Town Council's Awards Committee considered a total of four nominations from members of the public. Two residents were invited to accept an award and these were presented at the Horley in Bloom Awards Evening last September.

#### Previous recipients of the Town Award:-

#### 2008 Robert Garfitt

Robert has served the people of Horley as both a Borough and a Town Councillor. He was Mayor of Horley Town Council from 1988-1989 and Deputy Mayor of Reigate & Banstead Borough Council from 1990-1991. Robert has also served as a Justice of the Peace for many years.

#### Andrew Partridge

Andrew has served as a school governor for almost 25 years and has spent much of his time helping Horley's young people. He has been a committee member of the Horley Vimy Twinning Association since its inception and has worked tirelessly to promote Horley's link with Vimy. As a member of the Horley Lions, Andrew has helped raise around £20,000 per year for local charitable causes.

#### 2007 Andrew Kent

Andrew has worked tirelessly to improve and protect the local environment, bringing great knowledge and commitment to this role. His methodical, patient and immensely detailed work on the Horley Master Plan has been outstanding. He has served on the Horley Master Plan Task Group and the Horley Master Plan Advisory Committee. Andrew coordinated responses to the Local Plan, the County Structure Plan and presented evidence at Inquiries. He was instrumental in producing documents on flood risk in Horley.

Previously Chairman of the Horley Residents' Association 1993 - 2007 and a Horley Town Councillor from 1996 - 2007.

#### 2007Alan Tracey

Alan was the longstanding Chairman of the recently disbanded Police & Community Partnership Group, ensuring over the years that the people of Horley had meaningful direct contact with the local Police. He is also Secretary of the Naval Section of the Royal British Legion.

He has worked hard for the Archway Theatre and has tirelessly supported both Cooper Lodge and the Brambles Respite Care Centre, in his role as a volunteer entertainer.

#### 2005 Barbara Hall

In recognition of Barbara's support of local charitable organisations for more than forty years.

Barbara has been a member of the patients committee at the Kings Road Health Centre for many years and has recently become a non-executive director for the NHS East Surrey PCT and is also actively involved with Open Line through the Horley Help Shop.

#### 2005 David Hall

In recognition of David's outstanding voluntary work and charity work, as well as being a School Governor and a former member of Surrey County Council.

David has been Chairman of the Horley Local History Centre, based in the Library, and is very involved with the Local History Society. He also continues to conduct his own research into the town's history.

#### 2000 Andy Thompson




