# **Annual Town Meeting**

At the Town Meeting held on Friday, 26 April 2013, the Guest Speaker was Kevin Hurley, Police & Crime Commissioner for Surrey.

Mr Hurley was elected last November as the first Commissioner for Surrey. He explained his zero tolerance approach to policing; the greater visibility of street policing; putting victims at the centre of the Criminal Justice System; and allowing the public a greater say in how streets are policed.

In a lively question and answer session, several topics were discussed, including how performance was measured; how his work differs from that of the Surrey Police Authority; and how he is directly responsible to the electorate. In his first six months of office, he explained that he had made several strategic decisions, for example, he had put on hold the sale of Police Stations. He highlighted the unfairness of Surrey's financial burden

compared with a number of other counties, and added that he had been in touch with both the Home Secretary and the Chancellor to see if this matter might be addressed.

Presentations were also made to the winners of

# Himalayan Balsam Update Cllr David Powell reports......

"Himalayan Balsam is a major weed problem, especially on river banks and waste land. It is a prolific and invasive annual weed which grows 8 feet high. It is rapidly taking over many areas of rivers and wetlands across the nation.

A plan is in place for the next seven years to eradicate it from the local area. It grows rapidly and spreads quickly, smothering other vegetation as it grows. Both banks of the River Mole, where it runs through Horley, are heavily infested with the weed.

In order to eliminate Himalayan Balsam, we have now treated over 5,000 square metres of the eastern bank of the River Mole with herbicide, from the river bridge on the A23 opposite the Texaco Service Station, to the northernmost point of Court Lodge Fields.

Over several weekends, this summer, supplementary spot spraying took place to treat a few patches that had been missed and any individual plants, which escaped the spraying



process, have been pulled out manually by volunteers. In this way, approximately three quarters of a mile of river bank has been opened up to the public, for the first time in many years. Our thanks must go to local farmer Simon Court, for giving so much time to the project.

The whole operation has been volunteer led and will continue for the foreseeable future. Please contact the Town Council if you would like to become involved.

# Horley Bowling Club celebrates its Centenary this year



Bowling enthusiasts in the Surrey community of Horley have a wonderful facility in the Horley Bowling Club. Located in the town's Recreation Ground, with a splendid modern clubhouse and a beautifully manicured green, the Club plays throughout the summer months between April and September. In winter there is a thriving short mat bowls section.

In our Centenary year, we have enjoyed a full and varied fixture list with special events throughout the season. We are grateful for the support we have received from Horley Town Council, Horley Lions and local businesses such as Mitchells, Ian Taylor Body Repairs, Bateman Funeral Services, Vines of Redhill, Seldons Locksmiths and Burstow Nurseries.

The Club's earliest history is somewhat veiled to present members, but County records show that at the time of its affiliation in 1933 the Club was recorded as having been in existence 20 years, i.e. since 1913. We

know that in the twenties the old "St. Barts" Club played on a green behind the Church rooms in Albert Road.

Horley Parish Council ensured the continuance of this part of the town's traditions by laying out a new green in the Recreation Ground in 1964 and their involvement continues to this day with the Town Mayor, Richard Olliver, and Town Secretary, Alan Jones, opening the green in this special Centenary Year by bowling the first bowls of the outdoor season.

Other special events have included a visit from Royal Hospital Chelsea Pensioners and an Open Triples event which raised over £300 for Leukemia and Lymphoma Research.

We always welcome new bowlers: visit the Club and see what we have to offer. Free coaching is available by recognised coaches.

# Centenary of World War One Book of Dedication

2014 will see the Centenary of the First World War and local resident, Mr Doug Cox, has carried out extensive research to produce a Book of Dedication, giving details of the men of Horley who gave their lives during the 1914 – 1918 conflict and who are listed on the Horley War Memorial.

The Book has been commissioned by Horley Town Council and will be available to view in Horley Library next year. Biographies on all 122 heroes listed on Horley's War Memorial are being compiled for the book. All the men who feature on the Memorial will have one page each in the book. Town Clerk Alan Jones said he and his colleagues believed it was important to remember British and Commonwealth troops who were killed in the First World War.

"We are determined to make sure their bravery for their country is not forgotten" he said "The increase in attendances and awareness each year at the Horley Remembrance Day service is testament to this, especially as young people also take such a great interest." Two names on the Memorial, Frank Cooper and Frank Mills, are yet to be researched by Mr Cox. Floats were created by schools, pubs and other local organisations.
