Recycling Do's and Don'ts

Unless we recycle more now, Surrey's landfill sites will run out within 15 years. This will have a huge negative cost impact on Horley residents and the prospect of incineration will come closer.

DO use Reigate & Banstead's new Garden Waste Service. If you haven't got your new brown bin yet, order one from the Garden Waste Hotline (01737 276444) or online at www.reigate-banstead.gov.uk. If you have a real Christmas tree to dispose of, DO put it out, without decorations, next to your wheelie bin between 29 December and 17 January, on your collection day. If you have large quantities of waste to dispose of, or materials which can't be put in your re-cycling box, DO take them to your local recycling centre.

The average UK household throws away £420 worth of food a year, most of which could have been eaten. A colossal one third of all the food we buy ends up in the bin.

DO plan your purchasing to reduce this shocking and costly waste and save pounds.

DO prepare and cook only what your

family will eat, and no more. If you have a garden, DO compost weeds, prunings and other green waste, besides vegetable/fruit peelings. If you haven't got a composter DO order one on Reigate & Banstead's website for as little as £12. If you can afford more, DO invest in a rotary composter, which will produce more compost in less time and keep rodents at bay.

Plastic is a problem, being difficult and expensive to recycle.

DO avoid unnecessary packaging, e.g. buy loose apples rather than those wrapped in plastic on a polystyrene tray,

DO avoid "single use" products, and use refillable packages like fabric conditioner and washing powder, or invest in long life products like re-chargeable batteries and low energy light bulbs.

DO Store food in the fridge in a reusable container rather than wrapping it in cling film or foil. Avoid soft fruit in plastic punnets, but DO grow your own or visit pick-your-own farms.

DO use canvas shopping bags, saying 'no' to unwanted plastic carrier bags.





Garden Sharing Scheme

The high cost of food continues to hit families hard as the "consumer crunch" takes over from the "credit crunch. Not surprisingly, Horley now has a record number of people (60) on a three year waiting list for town council allotments.

We are therefore proposing to start a garden sharing scheme. Do you have part of your back garden to spare for vegetable growing (this needs to receive sufficient sunshine but need not be under any sort of cultivation)? Perhaps you are elderly, infirm or simply not keen on gardening. However, you still have to eat and would be happy to receive a quarter share of the produce if a visiting gardener does all the work. Or, are you itching to get working with fork and spade to grow your own food?
