


South & South East in Bloom

Charlesfield Road Entrance to Horley Recreation Ground

Residents living in Charlesfield Road are becoming increasingly concerned about anti social behaviour caused by youths leaving the Recreation Ground late at night, particularly at weekends, and spilling out into Charlesfield Road.

They are understandably very keen to have these matters resolved as quickly as possible. The Town Council has ensured that its CCTV cameras are regularly monitored and have organised regular security patrols in all the parks. Surrey Police also regularly check these areas, particularly at weekends. Some local residents want a gate installed at this entrance. However, the status of the path leading through the park is currently being reviewed by Surrey County Council. This will involve consultation with the Town Council as landowner of the park and with Reigate & Banstead Borough Council as owner of the footpath leading from the park into Charlesfield Road. Clearly any action such as a locked gate would impact on shift workers etc who might be unable to access or leave the park by this entrance at night.

The Town Council is keen to seek the views of all Horley residents who use the footpath which would assist all parties before any decision is taken. Please contact us and let us know your views.

Annual Accounts 2008/09 Conclusion of Audit

BDO Stoy Hayward LLP has completed the Annual Audit for the financial year ended 31 March 2009. The Auditor is satisfied with the Council's financial standing and issued a Notice of Completion on 8 October 2008, with an unqualified opinion, which means that the Town Council fully complies with the statutory requirements of the Accounts and Audit Regulations 2006. All cash reserves are held at UK banks and there has been no exposure to any offshore financial institutions.

The Council also fulfils the requirements of the Freedom of Information Act and any member of the public may, having given due notice, inspect any documentation that is covered by the legislation.

Consultation on Corporate Plan

Horley Town Council is in the process of updating its Corporate Plan for the next five years and the draft Plan will be presented to Full Council in December. Thereafter the Plan will be put out for public consultation. It will appear on the Town Council's website from 9 December 2009 and the consultation period will run until mid January 2010.

Landscaping work in the Ornamental Gardens at Horley Recreation Ground

Earlier this year, the Town Council commissioned extensive landscaping works at the Ornamental Gardens, situated in the central area of the Horley Recreation Ground. The works were carried out by Horley Garden Design & Landscaping, a local company. The Council's aim was to create an attractive and more open area, with additional access points and new benches, where visitors could relax in a pleasant and tranquil atmosphere.

To enhance the shrub beds and make them look more attractive, it was decided to dress some of them with bark chips and others with grey slates. Sadly, the subsequent actions of a small minority caused considerable problems, with slates being blatantly thrown around the park and into the playground and adjoining Bowling Club, causing safety issues for park users and considerable problems with mowing machinery. Increased visits by Security Patrols failed to resolve the problem and, reluctantly, after much discussion with local police, the Town Council had no option but to remove all the slates and replace them with bark chippings.
