Councillor Profiles

RICHARD BETHELL

Richard Bethell is the Town Council's Vice Chairman and is a councillor for the South Central ward. In his own words he writes: "I moved to Horley in 1982, with my wife Sharon and two boys aged 6 and 3. We like Horley's small town ambience. Living close to the town centre, we find that the station, shops, restaurants, Con Club and Council Offices are all within easy walking distance.

In the early part of my career, I specialised in Work Study

(popularly known as Time and Motion study) and Organisation & Methods. When these disciplines went out of fashion, I got involved in computer systems and project management, mostly at the London Stock Exchange, where I worked for 22 years. With a colleague, I then launched a start-up company (Compeer Ltd) to do competitor benchmarking, from which I retired after 15 enjoyable years. Amongst other things, I became competent in using the Microsoft Office program suite, which I still find very useful.

Voters in Horley South Central kindly elected me to the Town Council 3 years ago. I've enjoyed my time on the council, which in my view does an excellent job. I am increasingly impressed by the huge local knowledge and dedication of the town councillors and staff.

Apart from the Town Council, I am a keen amateur musician, playing various instruments. 

The Town Council has announced that the Precept has been set for a total net figure of £282,769 (compared to the net figure of £280,886 for 2009/10). This means that town element of Council Tax will be £32.80 which represents an annual increase of 11p per Band D household (+ 0.34 per cent).

The Town Council remains fully committed to maintaining all its services as well as pursuing its programme of enhancements, as detailed in its Corporate Plan. These will include improvements to recreation grounds and further improvements to community halls.

Prudent use of Council finances has allowed the Council to use £30,000 of its general reserves towards next year's costs. The rebuilding of the Albert Rooms is now complete, apart from some minor enhancements. As charges were already increased this financial year to take account of the improved facilities in the Edmonds Community Hall, there will be only modest

increases next year in line with inflation. Full details of all charges for 2010/11 are available from the Town Council Offices or from our web site.

The Town Council also has a duty to provide for future likely expenditure, and is therefore increasing its earmarked funds by £15,000 for football pitch improvements, buildings maintenance, playgrounds improvements and community funds.


The Town Council will continue to improve security in its recreation grounds. Therefore a provision has been made for further CCTV enhancements to be carried out in consultation with Surrey Police. There will also continue to be a commitment for regular security patrols in all our parks to aid the safety of all members of public.

In a challenging financial climate, Horley Town Council remains committed to providing and enhancing facilities that meet the communities' needs, and in doing so, achieving them at best value.

General Election 2010





While the date for this year's general election is not yet known, Reigate & Banstead Borough Council is urging residents not to wait until the date has been announced before they secure their right to vote. "The time between the election date being announced and the last chance to register to vote can be a matter of a few days," warns Returning Officer Nigel Clifford. "If you are not on the electoral register, you won't be able to vote."

"Many people assume they are automatically on the electoral register if they pay Council Tax or if they have voted before. This is not the case: you need to register every year and if you have moved house, you need to re-register with your new address.

Registering to vote only takes a few minutes; print off a form from www.reigate-banstead.gov.uk; or telephone 01737 276000.

The Returning Officer is also reminding electors who can't access a polling station for the election that they can apply for a postal vote. The deadline for postal vote applications is 5pm on 20 April.
