Town Awards

Horley Town Council is delighted to announce that there were two worthy recipients of the prestigious Town Awards for 2010. The awards were presented at the Horley in Bloom Awards Evening, which was held at Regent Hall on Friday, 24 September.

One Award was presented to Dr Jim Williamson and a posthumous Award was made to Kathleen Tremble and collected by her husband, Alex Tremble. The Awards were presented by Cllr David Pay, the Mayor of Reigate & Banstead, assisted by Town Mayor, Cllr Simon Marshall. A summary of the two citations follows:

Kathleen Tremble

"Kathleen campaigned to keep Horley in Surrey and worked hard to raise funds for the Horley Anderson Centre. She was a passionate supporter of literacy and, as a volunteer at Court Lodge, Sangers and latterly Manorfield Schools, helped a great many Horley children learn to read. Kathleen was active in the development of Manorfield School and for nearly thirty years served as a Local Education Authority Governor, until just before her death in March 2010. Kathleen was also active in the initial setting up of the Horley Learning Partnership, one of the first such confederations in the country."

"Jim is warmly remembered for his kind and compassionate manner as a GP. He was also a School Governor at Sangers Junior School and continues his association with the area as a judge for the Court Lodge in Colour competition, as well as being involved with both the Horley in Spring and Horley in Bloom events. Jim's wife, Antonia, has been a constant source of support to him and he was delighted to do the same for her in her many years as Chairperson of the Friends of St Barts. They freely make their garden available for fund raising activities, with Jim's trains bringing great delight to visitors. Jim is a much respected member of St Francis' Church and is a long standing trustee of Smith's Charity – Horley."

The Town Awards scheme has been in operation since 2000. Nominations for the Town Award are invited every year, when any member of the public can complete a nomination form, together with a seconder, to propose an individual for outstanding service or commitment to Horley.

The Town Council is responsible for the administration and final selection of award winners according to strict guidelines and criteria. An Awards Sub Committee reviews and makes recommendations and presentations are usually made either at the Annual Town Meeting, or at other appropriate events, subject to the award winners' approval.





The Reigate Group of the Ramblers is part of the Ramblers Association, which works to promote walking and to improve conditions for all walkers. Annual Accounts 2009/10 Conclusion of Audit

BDO Stoy Hayward LLP has completed the Annual Audit for the financial year ended 31 March 2010. The Auditor is satisfied with the Council's financial standing and issued a Notice of Completion on 27 September 2010, with an unqualified opinion, which means that the Town Council fully complies with the statutory requirements of the Accounts and Audit Regulations 2006.

All cash reserves are held at UK banks and there has been no exposure to any offshore financial institutions. The Council also fulfils the requirements of the Freedom of Information Act and any member of the public may, having given due notice, inspect documentation that is covered by the legislation.

Horley Environment Week

Horley Environment Week started as an embryonic idea in July this year. An excellent team, ably led by Environment Committee Chairman Cllr David Powell and assisted by Cllr Richard Bethell, worked fast and furiously to facilitate the birth of Horley Environment Week, which took place from Monday 20 September to Saturday 25 September.

The Environment Week was planned with a single objective in mind: to actively encourage local residents and businesses to lower their use of fossil fuels by making sensible lifestyle changes, thereby making a significant contribution towards the prevention of climate change.

A vigorous publicity campaign was set in motion. Cllr David Powell came up with our slogan: "Go Horley - go green!" and, to everyone's delight, Britaniacrest Recycling supplied free yellow tee shirts, complete with the logo, which were worn by many, members and staff alike, during the week.

Some examples of the initiatives promoted were:

- · Reducing/eliminating plastic shopping bags during the Environment Week.
- · Improving residents' recycling participation.
- · Bringing together a "Friends of Horley" group of residents to periodically participate in environmental campaigns.
- · Organising one or two litter-picking forays of "Grot Spots", using volunteers from youth/community groups

and volunteer residents.

- · Improving business and household conservation of energy, water and other vital resources.
- · Involving local schools in an Eco Art competition

Residents were asked to tick at least 5 out of the 10 pledges listed in a specially prepared leaflet, and to add anything else that they believed should be considered, to help protect the environment. These were submitted either by post or via the town council's website.

The week began with the arrival of the Reigate & Banstead Recycling Roadshow, which stood in the Pedestrian Precinct for most of Monday, allowing local residents to ask questions and make comments about local schemes. The rest of the week passed at a meteoric pace.



There was an overwhelming response from Waitrose, Tesco and Collingwood Batchellor to support the campaign. Many other shops in Horley agreed to promote the event by displaying Environment Week posters.

Tesco at Hookwood established a shop front display in the foyer manned by two ladies dressed in green selling two "Bags for Life" for the price of one, whilst a "Bag for Life" cartoon character created a bit of fun around the stand. Town Councillors visited the store throughout the week, distributing the pledge leaflets, assisted at various times by the local Scouts and Sam Gyimah MP. Waitrose in Horley gave away around 1500 Bags for Life during the week and the pledge leaflets were in abundance around the store. Collingwood Batchellor also joined in the campaign, distributing free linen bags for life to their customers.

Decisions were eventually made and prizes were presented to the winners at the three schools by Sam Gyimah MP, Reigate & Banstead Mayor Cllr David Pay and Town Mayor Cllr Simon Marshall. The prizes took the form of vouchers, provided at a discounted price by Mud Pie Ceramics in Horley.

Demolition of the former Court Lodge School in Horley has been completed to make way for the new Leisure Centre. The work is being carried out by Pellikaan Construction Ltd. As the main buildings were demolished, the masonry was crushed on site to provide hardcore for the foundations of the new building.

Construction has now commenced and it is anticipated that the new centre will be open to the public in January 2012. The centre will feature a 25 metre swimming pool with full disabled access, a teaching pool, sports hall, fitness gym and exercise / dance studio.
