

VE/VJ Day 60th Anniversary

The Horley Branch of the Royal British Legion held a parade and service on Sunday 7 August to commemorate the 60th anniversary of VE and VJ days.

The open air service was held at the War Memorial in the Horley A23 Recreation Ground. The Royal British Legion Chaplain Rev. John Glasspool conducted the service and the reading was made by Major General Michael Steele MBE DL.

This was the first time that the town's new public address system had been used. The system was purchased with money allocated by Surrey County Councillors Kay Hammond and Dorothy Ross Tomlin. The equipment will shortly be available for use and hire by local organisations.

The Town Council has submitted a planning application for permission to install a Multipurpose Football/Basketball court, which it hopes to site in the vicinity of the skateboard park. The project has been discussed with various organisations and clubs including the Horley Youth Council and Surrey Police.

The majority of the funding will come from Reigate & Banstead Borough Council through planning conditions (Section 106). This is just one of a number of improvements planned for the park. Several new items of equipment will soon be appearing in the playground, including a roundabout and a new slide. Additional CCTV cameras will also be installed to protect the park and its users. On Saturday 27 August Metrobus began operating the new Fastway Route 20 service in Horley, replacing the Gatwick Direct 200 service.

The company purchased six new buses to operate on the route, taking the total number of vehicles in the fleet to seventeen.

The route provides a frequent link between Langshott, Horley Railway Station, Horley Town Centre, Gatwick Airport, City Place, Three Bridges Station, Crawley Town Centre and South Broadfield.


