P 5566 Apologies and Reasons for Absence

RESOLVED: that the apologies of Cllr Jackson be accepted for reasons as specified in the Attendance Register.

Public Forum

P 5568 Alchemy Night Club, Consort Way, Horley

A group of town centre residents addressed the Committee about the planned reopening of 'Alchemy' night club, Consort Way, Horley after an application to transfer the premises licence from the existing holders to new operators was granted by the Borough Council.

A number of speakers raised concerns about the new night club (formerly known as 'Flirt') as the venue had a history of disturbances which required police intervention on many occasions. Members were asked for their support to request a review of the premises licence since the location had changed dramatically from a business area to that of residential.

The Clerk advised that he had already been in contact with the RBBC Licensing Manager for further information. He was informed that the new operators had legally transferred over the licence since the police were the only legitimate objectors and had not done so. However, Police Officers did meet with the new owners to make some recommendations and licensing objectives to keep the peace. It was also made clear that should the new night club create any problems in relation to the licensing objectives, then the licence could be reviewed and the premises put before a licensing committee to determine the best course of action.

P 5568) The Chairman thanked the speakers for their comments. Members were in agreement that the reopening of the night club, up until 3.30 am, could be disasterous in view of previous experience and the increase of residential properties within such close proximity. It was decided that a letter would be sent from the Town Council to the RBBC Licensing & Regulation Manager, to request a review of the premises licence accordingly. It would also be suggested that if a review was not possible, then extensive surveillance be implemented with immediate action taken against antisocial behaviour with the supporting evidence. (A letter was subsequently sent from the Town Council to the RBBC Licensing Manager, and a further update would be provided at the next meeting.)

RESOLVED: that the Clerk provide an update on the premises licence at the Alchemy night club, Consort Way, Horley at the next meeting of this Committee.

P 5570 Operation Horizon: Outstanding Highways Works in Horley

The Clerk advised that a response to the Town Council's letter regarding new funding arrangements impacting on highways maintenance in Horley was received from Sam Gyimah MP. In his reply, he stated that this was a difficult and delicate situation on which he was as yet unable to provide any further information. He did, however, pass on his reassurance that he would remain in regular contact with the Leader of Surrey County Council as well as his fellow Surrey MPs and the Secretary of State. He would also keep the Town Council updated on developments as matters evolved.

P 5571 Cllr Hudson told members that the further replies he received from SCC Highways on outstanding repairs to pavements, safety measures and signage in Horley, were overall disappointing. It was explained that necessary pavement works, such as Albert Road, were included in the forward programme to be reconstructed between 2018 and 2021 (subject to available budgets). For other locations, only pavements near schools, health centres or town/village centres would be reconstructed as part of 'Pavement Horizon'. In addition, other safety improvements or concerns about traffic timings should be reported online so that each case could be determined following a site inspection by a highways officer.

The SCC Highways Manager further advised that reports were now available on the SCC Highways & Transport Asset Management Strategy and Capital Prioritisation Policy for Highways Assets; Roads, Footways, Structures, Drainage & Safety Barriers. These documents provided details on how spending from available capital budgets would be determined together with prioritisation policies and the criteria used to implement improvements.

P 5590 Surrey County Council Consultation: Proposed Removal of 'NO ENTRY' signs - Lumley Road and Albert Road, Horley (Closing Date: 3 February 2017)

The proposed improvement measures with regard to the 'No Entry' signs on Lumley Road and Albert Road arising from many complaints of the signs being ignored by some motorists, were discussed. Surrey Highways were seeking views on the proposals to remove the existing signs and to install a 20 mile per hour speed limit in Albert Road and Lumley Road.

Members thought that the removal of the 'No Entry' signs might be a possible solution but felt that a better option would be to make Lumley Road and Albert Road one way in opposite directions. Albert Road could be one way going south, and Lumley Road one way going north which would enable a continuous flow of traffic around the roads, using left turns, without any hold up with two-way traffic negotiating parked cars in both roads as is the current situation. Traffic flow could be kept to reasonable speeds by existing calming measures. Support for the proposal of a 20mph speed limit was poor as it was felt it would not be adhered to and difficult to enforce. It was decided that the Chairman would prepare a response accordingly for submission to Surrey Highways, and ratification at the next meeting of this Committee.

RESOLVED: that the Town Council's response to the above Consultation by Surrey County Council on the Proposed Removal of the 'NO ENTRY' signs on Lumley Road and Albert Road, be ratified at the next meeting of this Committee.

P 5591 RBBC Public Survey: Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) – Reigate & Banstead Local Improvements Fund (Closing Date: 6 February 2017)

The Clerk updated members on the *public survey* launched by RBBC, seeking views on the **Reigate and Banstead Local Improvements Fund.** He said that the Town Council were also consulting with local residents and business owners for suggestions on how the money could be spent in Horley from the 15% proportion collected from local development (subject to available funds), such as, improvements to a community hall, new playground equipment or upgrades to local walking/cycling routes. The results of the RBBC survey, relevant to Horley, would be passed to the Town Council in due course. A further update on developments would be provided at the next meeting of this committee and published on the HTC website for information.

RESOLVED: that the Clerk provides a further update on the Community Infrastructure Levy Local Fund at the next meeting of this Committee.

P 5592 Proposed Horley Business Park

Members commented that since the launch of the new website by **Horley Business Park Development LLP (HBPD LLP)** in partnership with RBBC and Millhill Properties
(Horley) Ltd, no further details had become available. It was felt that this was
disappointing in view of the fact that proposals to explore options for developing an
office-based business park on the outskirts of Horley was announced in October
